Modern Slavery and the Supply Chain

In compliance with the Modern Slavery Act 2015, Monaghan Mushrooms offers the following statement regarding its efforts to prevent slavery and human trafficking in its supply chain.

Policies and Training relating to Modern Slavery

The Monaghan Mushrooms Group is committed to preventing, uncovering and reporting slavery and human trafficking within its supply chain and we adopt a zero tolerance approach. We recognise that modern slavery is a complex supply chain issue, and we work in partnership with our Customers, Suppliers, with NGO's and other organisations to help develop long-term solutions to this issue. We fully comply with the provisions of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and we are accountable for our actions.

We support the work being done to reduce forced labour and human trafficking in the UK. We have staff at each site who have been externally trained in the exploitation of human labour and we have encompassed the principles of "Stronger Together" across each of our sites. We will continue to train and educate our workforce in this area giving them the mechanism to highlight and report potential issues.

Supply Chain Management

We are members of SEDEX (Suppliers Ethical Data Exchange) and we are regularly audited by third parties who publish our audit results on the SEDEX portal. This is a web-based database where suppliers post labour standards information and self-assessments in addition to all site audit reports.

We internally review our supply chain to evaluate human trafficking and slavery risks and we conduct supplier audits which review all aspects of the supply chain including safety, human trafficking, child labour and other legal requirements.
